

About The Mill

For this year's adult membership giclée, Pat returns to one of her favorite subjects, McConnell's Mill in Moraine State Park, Butler County, Pennsylvania. While the mill itself has a real and distinct presence in time and place, (it was first constructed in 1852 and then rebuilt in 1868 after a fire). Pat's treatment of it is timeless and hints at something beyond the moment.

Pat takes the physical reality of the mill as a starting point and renders it in such a way as to encourage us to invest the scene with our own emotional response. In all of Pat's landscapes it is this emotional content that is more meaningful, more "real" than reality itself. Pat does not paint with

the exactitude of a realist painter. She paints expressively. She merely nods at reality and asks us to see through it, to contemplate the very soul of her subject.

How would we describe this scene? Perhaps as "tranquil" or "peaceful" and "calming." These are emotions that we bring to the scene. Deeper than that, there is the harmony of balance. Pat contrasts the soft, smooth curves of the round rocks with the hard, lineal wooden boards of the mill, the straight borders of

the stonework, and the lined-up masonry that makes up the foundation of the mill. With a few dashes of paint, Pat brings to life the free-flowing water (we can almost hear its lyrical motion) and contrasts this with the solid stasis of the building. These opposing elements are in balance, poised and in harmony—see how the man-made stonework seems to grow organically out of Nature, out of the rocks and the foliage.

Pat here has created a vision of man in harmony with Nature. The mill is the work of the hands of many men, hewn out of native rock and timber, and a symbol not only of man's labor, but of his bending Nature to his purpose. The flowing stream provides the motion and energy needed to grind the grain (grain which is itself the fruit of Nature, cultivated by man).

And so it is that Pat has taken a much loved Pennsylvania landmark and turned it into something so much more meaningful than itself, so that it holds appeal to all of us, whether or not we are familiar with the "real" mill itself.

For many years, she has given up weekends and holidays to work. Hundreds of families in the area have improved their chances at better lives due to Boo's dedication and ceaseless energy.


2012 Alaska Cruise



Foundation Awards 2011 Teacher Grants

The P. Buckley Moss Foundation for Children's Education is pleased to announce the recipients for the 2011 Moss Foundation Grants. These seven grants will further programs to provide educational opportunities through the arts to children who learn differently. The total amount of these awards is \$4,000. In 2010, the Foundation received around sixty grant applications and received over 200 in 2011. Your donations to the Foundation are greatly appreciated to help fund its grants and scholarships.

Ms. Melanie Huffman Goddard High School, Goddard, KS Introduction to Art Class: \$800

The class provides units in drawing, painting, printmaking, ceramics, and fibers. The program allows students with disabilities an opportunity to find a form of art that allows them to use their strengths and find success, while encouraging growth in weaker motor skill and visual areas.

Ms. Christine Salazar Sul Ross Middle School San Antonio, TX Rebel Mural Project: \$700

This is a hands-on artistic program, in which students engage in tactile, visual, and kinetic learning, using creative expression through most art forms. The program will empower students with self-confidence to communicate artistically by making a historical mark at Sul Ross Middle School.

Ms. Tonya Griffin Gatewood PEEP, Newport News, VA Creatively Yours Program: \$500

This program provides students with developmental delays and sensory issues the opportunity to experience concepts of art. The students will develop or increase fine motor skills as well as hand-eye coordination.

Ms. Patricia Stoneback Lehigh Learning and Adjustment School Orefield, PA

Teaching History through Art Project: \$500

This project seeks to better engage students in classroom learning and broaden their knowledge of the study of arts, architecture, and artifacts to unveil the history of various cultures.

West Babylon Junior High School, West Babylon, NY Self-Motivated Learning &

Community Service Project: \$500

Students will participate in a reading program in which they may read novels of their choice. Each student will creatively illustrate and decorate a tapestry square depicting a scene from the novel. Additionally, students will write friendly letters to their peers in a local hospital, encouraging them to "snuggle up with a cozy blanket and a good book." The decorated squares will be quilted to form five blankets and donated to the hospital's children's ward, along with select copies of the books illustrated.

Ms. Jo-Lin D. Owens West Irvine Elementary, Irvine, KY Barn Quilt Art Program: \$500

This program will help bring a piece of Appalachian culture/art to students in a project that allows them to learn about barn quilting first-hand from local artists. The Appalachian Barn Quilt Trail will be explored through the internet, pictures, and local newspapers featuring the Trail. Students will create their own quilt patterns using a variety of methods, including but not limited to painting, paper collage, and drawing with colored pencils.

Ms. Julie J. Carter Center High School, King and Queen Courthouse, VA Ceramics Project: \$500

This project will allow students to see ceramic pieces at the DeWitt Wallace Decorative Arts Museum in Colonial Williamsburg, giving students a better idea of how functional ceramic pieces were created during Colonial times. The DeWitt Museum allows museum patrons to view in detail the process used to create Tory mugs and fine porcelain china. The students will return to school and create Tory mugs using the three ceramic hand building methods.

Scholarship Deadlines

The P. Buckley Moss Foundation for Children's Education administers three scholarships that were initiated by the Society, and all applications must be submitted to the Foundation office at 152 P. Buckley Moss Drive, Waynesboro, VA 22980. Criteria and application forms are available on both the Society's website (www.mosssociety.org) and the Foundation's (www.mossfoundation.org), but any questions should be referred to the Foundation office at 540-932-1728.

Completed applications for the P. Buckley Moss Endowed Scholarship, the Anne and Matt Harbison Scholarship, and the Judith Cary Leadership Memorial Scholarship must be postmarked no later than March 31, 2012.

Chapters Continue Charity Efforts, Activities

APPLESEEDS OF MOSS Chapter (Bellefontaine, OH) combined the proceeds of their annual Christmas Jar Project (\$279.11) with a donation in the amount of \$600 from the Belle Center, Ohio, Presbyterian Church. With this money, they were able to purchase Christmas presents and supplies for a Christmas party for 95 residents of Logan Acres Nursing Home.

CENTRAL IOWA Chapter (Des Moines, IA) members gathered school supplies for Willard School in Des Moines, including crayons, glue sticks, constructions paper, and cleaning supplies. The Chapter further supported first grade teacher Heidi Schoper by cutting and organizing teaching aides for her room. Members also gave Heidi a \$200 gift card to the Office Depot and a \$100 gift card to the Learning Post for her to purchase supplies for her room. The Chapter also donated \$1,000 to the school's music department for the purchase of a sound system and presented a Christmas gift bag to each student in Heidi Schoper's first grade class.

The Chapter also donated a total of \$205 to the therapeutic riding program at Jester Park Equestrian Center in Granger, Iowa. The funds will provide a scholarship of three hours of therapy for a deserving student.

Chapter members purchased Christmas gifts for two families in December, spending \$300 and \$200 on each family respectively. The gifts included a \$50 gift card to a local grocery store for each family.

FRIENDS MEETING Chapter (Waynesville, OH) members supported GreeneBucs, which is the Greene County Chapter of National AMBUCS™, Inc. AMBUCS™ is a national non-profit service organization dedicated to creating mobility and independence for children and adults with disabilities through the provision of AmTryke® therapeutic tricycles. Fundraising activities included the sale of wine glasses and glass "cat" plates as well as a fundraising dinner with P. Buckley Moss and Canada Goose Gallery. During the fundraising dinner, a quilt incorporating Pat's hand-painted quilt centerpieces was auctioned, with half of the proceeds from the quilt benefiting GreeneBucs and the other half benefiting the P. Buckley Moss Foundation for Children's Education. The total funds earned for GreeneBucs was \$5,563.20. The amount raised for Pat's Foundation was \$3.050.

While Pat was in town for the fundraising dinner and her show with Canada Goose Gallery, Friends Meeting members assisted with a Walk with Moss event that raised \$1,585 for PALS for Life (breast cancer support group) and \$1,645 for the Dale Bowman Memorial Scholarship Fund.

The Chapter also assisted St. Mary's Parish Ladies Sodality of Urbana, Ohio, with a raffle to benefit the St. Mary's Church Christmas Bazaar. A Moss print was donated by the Society, and the framing was donated by Canada Goose Gallery. The *Winter Together* print earned \$752.50, and the lucky winner was Kace Sowards of Springfield, Ohio.

PAT'S BLUE GOOSE Chapter (Louisa, VA) raised an outstanding \$17,532 to benefit Kevin Hayward, a young man who suffered brainstem injuries as a result of a car accident in 2009. Chapter members conducted two Longaberger® Basket bingos, which earned \$12,310, and raffled a Moss print donated by the Society's Charity Print Program, which earned \$4,241. The remarqued Beyond the Falls was framed by Framecraft of Warrenton, Virginia, and the tickets were donated by Around the World Gifts of Louisa, Virginia. The lucky winner was Dot Hiter of Gordonsville, Virginia. The Chapter also received donations in the amount of \$951 and a gift certificate for \$30. Kevin's family will use the money to make a van handicap accessible for Kevin and to also help cover the cost of dental work and physical and occupational therapy.

The Chapter donated fifteen Mardi Gras goodie bags for the Chapter Training/Summer Celebration weekend and served breakfast at Chapter Training, will sponsor a teacher for the 2012 Foundation Conference, and visited the residents at the Gordon House in Gordonsville and Louisa Health Care in Louisa.

In addition, the Chapter worked with the Housing Department of Louisa to build a ramp on the home of Nicholas William (the Chapter's 2010 fundraising recipient). Nicholas is confined to a wheelchair. The Housing Department provided the materials, and Chapter members and their husbands supplied the labor.

Of special interest, Chapter member Alice Colvin received her bachelor's degree in history, with a minor in women's studies, in May of 2011. Alice is 80 years old! Congratulations!

Total raised for charity in these chapter reports is well over \$46,404.81! Outstanding!

P.B.'S PALS Chapter (Collinsville, IL) received a Winter Together Moss print from the Society's Charity Print Program, and the framing was donated by The Art Loft Gallery in Collinsville, Illinois. The Chapter held a raffle and donated the proceeds of \$1,058 to the "Tote Me Home" Project sponsored by the Collinsville Area Ministerial Association/Food Pantry. The project provides food for needy children over weekends. The lucky winner of the raffle was Sue Popov. The Chapter also assisted the Lynn F. Solon Foundation of Edwardsville, Illinois, in applying for a print from the Society. The group received a Country Retreat Moss print, which was framed by The Art Loft. The print earned \$125 in a silent auction.

MOSS IN THE COUNTRY Chapter (Daleville/N. Roanoke, VA) received a print donation from the Society's Charity Print Program and raffled a *Pigeon Forge Mill* Moss print, which raised \$3,000. The lucky winner was Charles Hubbard, and the recipient of the proceeds was the Botetourt Fuel Assistance Program.

Members also collected soup and crackers to donate to a local Soup for Seniors organization and collected drink tabs to support their local Ronald McDonald House. They also prepared and served a hot meal for guests at the Ronald McDonald House in the month of May. Members brought items needed for residents at the Rescue Mission and donated food and paper products to the Botetourt Food Pantry. Their

contribution to the food pantry included the donation of \$300 for staples; items such as beans, pasta, and rice were purchased in bulk and repackaged by members for donation to the food pantry. Additionally, the Chapter gave two \$50 donations to the After Prom Parties of Lord Botetourt High School and James River High School. They also donated items for the Mardi Gras goodie bags that were auctioned during the Summer Celebration event hosted by P. Buckley Moss Galleries, Ltd., to benefit the Moss Foundation.

MOSS IN THE VALLEY Chapter (Roanoke, VA) conducted a raffle throughout the year to raise money to benefit Special Olympics' fund to establish a local scholarship program for younger athletes who are unable to financially pay for bowling. In addition, they will purchase sports uniforms and equipment for school age children who cannot afford them. They will also begin a new program for pre-school children called "Little Feet Meet". The first prize was a framed, remarqued Moss print Serenity, framing donated by Graphics, Etc., of Roanoke, Virginia. The lucky winner was Melody Dean. The second prize was a hand-appliquéd, handpieced quilt made by Don Bunce. The lucky winner was Kevin Meadow. The real winner was Special Olympics of Virginia, which received the raffle proceeds of \$2,520.

The Chapter also raised money during the year to be able to send three teachers to the Foundation's Conference. Additionally, the Chapter donated \$330 to the Ronald McDonald House to help with their operating expenses as well as provision of dinner for the guests, twenty Beanie Babies, drinks, and cupcakes at an estimated value of \$200 and children's books valued at \$50. The Chapter also filled thirty bags for adults and ten buckets for children for Turning Point Shelter for Battered Women with an estimated value of \$675 and donated approximately \$100-worth of personal items for their use. The Chapter also supported Chapter Training and the Summer Celebration by furnishing dessert for lunch at an estimated \$150, donating a chapter basket to be raffled with a value of \$50, and providing approximately \$100-worth of items for the Mardi Gras goodie bags.

MOSS IN THE NEW RIVER VALLEY

Chapter (Dublin, VA) donated \$2,135 to Beulah House in Dublin, Virginia, which is a local hospice house (an additional \$365 was reported in the December, 2011, issue); \$1,500 to Blacksburg Middle School Special Education Department for the purchase of two iPads and iPad applications; and \$1,000 to the Tri-County Free Clinic for the purchase of a projector and tapes. Chapter members also collected aluminum tabs for the Ronald McDonald House in Roanoke; yarn for Scarves of Hope to complete scarves for cancer patients in the New River Valley; and canned food, household products, and personal care items for the Beulah House.
