
Letter from Pat

We are pleased to announce a new bead for 2015 members who join or renew at the Premier or Choice membership levels. The bead for 2015 features one of Pat's trademark horses, cast in sterling silver, and the reverse of the bead again features Pat's "Moss" signature logo. The bead is made in

the United States by the same master jeweler who made our first two beads; and, like those, it is designed to fit the bracelets of popular bead manufacturers like Pandora. It may also be worn on a necklace.

Foundation Awards 2014 Teacher Grants

(Grant monies to be used for the 2015 school year)

The P. Buckley Moss Foundation for Children's Education is pleased to announce the recipients for the 2014 Moss Foundation Grants. The grant monies will be used for the 2015 school year. These five grants will further programs to provide educational opportunities through the arts to children who learn differently. The total amount of these awards is \$3,598.98.

Sensory Tactile Art Curriculum: \$875.00

Children learn to express their ideas as they investigate a variety of media beyond crayons, watercolor, and finger paints. Their investigations in the creative art process involve all of their senses in hands-on experiences in clay, paint, inks, collage, and puppetry. Sticky, slippery, gooey, heavy, bumpy—that's what sensory experiences are made of.

Sallye B. Mathis School, Jacksonville, FL
Incorporating the Arts with Literacy: \$613.98

The purpose of this program is to enhance and strengthen literacy through the development of an illustrated book. Students will explore language and vocabulary to write a story and create drawings, paintings, or diagrams to illustrate their story, making it easier to understand. Copies of the final book will be printed and added to the school library.

Royal Live Oaks Academy of Arts and Science, Hardeeville, SC
Connecting Countries and Cultures: \$856.42

The group mural activity will bring art and culture to life in the art classroom. Students will learn the impact that art can have on communities once they have been a part of that impact.

Painting through Science: \$994.89

Students will learn to paint a scene, an animal, a plant, or something from nature the students will study in science. Students will research the topic, present to peers, and create artist's cards to go along with their paintings. Once all paintings are completed, they will be displayed in the school for students and staff to view and provide positive comments.

Mather High School, Chicago, IL
Integrating the Arts into Mathematics: \$258.69

Algebra I students will be introduced to the basic concept of polygons as they prepare for Geometry. Students will create three-dimensional dream catchers through representation and application of at least four polygons, using different colors of yarn and repeating pattern to showcase each polygon, aiding in identifying and classifying polygons.

Foundation News (cont.) Scholarship Deadlines

The P. Buckley Moss Foundation for Children's Education administers three scholarships that were initiated by the Society, and all applications must be submitted to the Foundation office at 108 S. Wayne Ave., Waynesboro, VA 22980. Criteria and application forms are available on both the Society's website (www.mosssociety.org)

and the Foundation's (www.moss-foundation.org), but any questions should be referred to the Foundation office at 540-932-1728.

The 2014 award of the Anne and Matt Harbison Scholarship was the last new Harbison Scholarship that will be given. However, the Foundation will honor renewals of the existing awarded Harbison Schol-

arships until those students have graduated.

Completed applications for the P. Buckley Moss Endowed Scholarship and the Judith Cary Leadership Memorial Scholarship must be postmarked no later than March 31, 2015.

Chapters Continue Charity Efforts, Activities

DAUGHTER OF THE STARS

Chapter (Strasburg, VA) members raised funds in 2013 through an annual auction among themselves and a 50/50 drawing at each meeting. Additionally, they obtained an *Autumn in the Valley* print from the Society's Charity Print Program, which raised \$566 via a raffle. The lucky winner was Aaron Mitchell. The Chapter made the following donations: \$50 to the Christmas Party for Special Kids, \$50 to the Empty Stocking Project, \$25 to The Compassion Cupboard food pantry, \$25 to The Pregnancy Center, \$25 to The Free Clinic, and \$25 to Response (assists families with domestic problems). The Chapter also awarded four scholarships of \$250 each to special education graduates, two at Strasburg High School and two at Sherando High School.

In 2014, the Chapter obtained a *Springtime at Meems* print from the Society, which raised \$1,026 via a raffle. King James Galleries of Winchester supported the Chapter in the sale of raffle tickets and also donated framing for the print. The lucky winner was Jim Zebbenhoff. Additional funds were raised through the members' annual auction and a 50/50 drawing at each meeting. Members also

sold hanging baskets in the spring. The Chapter made the following donations in 2014: \$50 to the Christmas Party for Special Kids, \$50 to the Empty Stocking Project, \$50 to The Compassion Cupboard food pantry, \$50 to The Pregnancy Center, \$50 to The Free Clinic, and \$50 to Response. The Chapter also awarded three scholarships totaling \$1,100 to special education graduates, two at Strasburg High School and one at Sherando High School.

FRIENDS MEETING Chapter (Waynesville, OH) members raised \$2,014.48 for PALS for Life Breast Cancer Support Group, \$1,000.00 for the P. Buckley Moss Foundation for Children's Education, and \$3,652.50 for Greenebucs in 2013. Greenebucs is the Greene County Chapter of National AMBUCS™, Inc., a non-profit service organization dedicated to creating mobility and independence for children and adults with disabilities. Funds were raised in conjunction with Pat's show with Canada Goose Gallery. The Chapter sponsored a Wednesday evening fundraising dinner for Greenebucs and PALS for Life that included a gift bag sale and a raffle (prizes included two framed Moss prints and a throw-sized quilt that was created

and stitched by Creative Fires in Springfield, OH). The Chapter also sponsored a Thursday evening fundraising dinner for Greenebucs that included a silent auction, raffle, and the live auction of a quilt that incorporated one of Pat's hand-painted centerpieces. The quilt was created and stitched by Marian Gebele of Beavercreek, OH. The proceeds of this quilt were split 50/50 between Greenebucs and the Moss Foundation for Children's Education. This was the fourth such quilt pieced and stitched by Ms. Gebele. Finally, the Chapter hosted a Saturday morning fundraising breakfast for PALS for Life that included the sale of raffle tickets for a framed *One Step Closer* print and a throw-sized quilt that was created and stitched by Creative Fires. During each of the three events, Greenebucs presented a tryke to a child with mobility issues

MOSS AT THE LAKE Chapter (Moneta, VA) members awarded their Trish Walker Memorial Scholarship in the amount of \$500 to Merissa Brooks in 2013 and the same amount to a Franklin County High School senior in 2014.

MOSS COUNTRY FRIENDS Chapter (Kalona, IA) members

raised funds in 2013 through their annual silent auction and potluck birthday party in June and their fundraising dinner and auction held in conjunction with The Village Shoppe's show with Pat in November. One of the items auctioned during the November fundraising event was a quilted wall hanging featuring one of Pat's hand-painted centerpieces. This was the fifth such quilt pieced and stitched by member Pearl Yoder. Pat herself was the lucky winner, with a winning bid of \$450. Half of the proceeds from the quilt auction went to the Chapter's charity projects, and half went to the P. Buckley Moss Foundation for Children's Education. The Chapter purchased a \$241 mobility tryke for a three-year-old girl with cerebral palsy, purchased a tryke for a second child with cerebral palsy with a cost of \$1,518.98, helped a five-year-old with an all-terrain stroller with a cost of \$1,469.96, and purchased an i-Pad with i-Talk to help a twenty-year-old woman communicate with a cost of \$635.94.

Additionally, the Chapter obtained a remarked Moss print, *A Peaceful Place*, from the Society's Charity Print Program and raffled it to raise funds for Sunrise Child Care, Inc., in Wellman, IA. Framing was donated by The Village Shoppe. The \$1,083.20 raised was used to purchase art supplies, equipment, and classes for staff. Becky Bohlken of Iowa City, IA, was the lucky winner. The Chapter also provided items worth \$250 each for their Birthday Bag project for the Kalona Food Pantry and the Wellman Food Pantry. Items included cake mix, frosting, disposable pans, candy for favors, plastic forks, plates, cups, napkins, and cake decorating items. Chapter

members also hosted a Vi Bella Jewelry presentation. Vi Bella was founded by a woman in State Center, IA, to benefit Haitian women to earn a living to feed their families. They make jewelry from various materials and sell them through parties. The theme of the company is "Women Helping Women."

In 2014, Moss Country Friends donated four Moss plates with an approximate value of \$80 each to help raise funds for the West High School Functional Skills Program in Iowa City, the Learning Disabilities Association Iowa Conference, the P. Buckley Moss Foundation for Children's Education (fundraising dinner held in Kalona on October 4), and the Central Iowa Chapter (fundraising luncheon held in the spring). For the Moss Foundation fundraiser, the Chapter also donated a lighted Moss wine bottle (\$100) and an Iowa Hawkeye gift basket (\$85). The Chapter also provided an indoor swing with a cost of \$418.66 for a 9-year-old child, donated \$100 to help with the medical expenses of a 3-year-old who has multiple seizures daily, and donated \$250 to help a family build a ramp at their front door to improve accessibility for a child with cerebral palsy. Additionally, the Chapter provided a meal at the Iowa City Ronald McDonald House with a cost of \$367.24 and donated items worth \$300 for the House's supplies. Chapter members also helped with Pat's show at The Village Shoppe in Kalona and also with the Foundation's fundraising dinner and auction.

MOSS IN THE FOREST Chapter (Forest, VA) members conducted a raffle in 2013 using a remarked *Nurses Three* print obtained from the Society's Charity Print Pro-

gram. The raffle proceeds of \$1,000 were donated to the Central Foundation of Lynchburg's College of Nursing to purchase supplies and equipment for the pediatric lab. The framing was donated by Picture Perfect of Lynchburg, VA, and the lucky winner was Chapter President Marie Pearson.

In 2013 and 2014, the Chapter also collected and donated items for the Salvation Army in Lynchburg, assembled flower arrangements and goodies in teacups and mugs for distribution to cancer patients at Lynchburg General Hospital, collected and donated supplies for the Network House for Women (a shelter) in Lynchburg, collected supplies for the Operation Christmas Child Shoe Box Project through Samaritan's Purse, and donated items to the Domestic Violence Prevention Center in Lynchburg.

MOSS PELICANS Chapter (St. Petersburg, FL) members continued to collect aluminum pop tops for the St. Joseph's Children's Hospital in Tampa, FL; donated approximately \$200-worth of clothing to the Clothes for Kids Project in St. Petersburg; donated approximately \$1,000-worth of clothing as well as other items to the Women's Residence (a division of the St. Petersburg Free Clinic); donated non-perishable food items valued at \$100 to the Food Pantry (a division of the St. Petersburg Free Clinic); collected and donated books and magazines to the St. Petersburg V.A. Medical Center; and volunteered at the Meals for Hope program in 2013.

The Chapter also conducted a raffle for a matted and framed original watercolor that was donated by Pat. The lucky winner

was Peggy Powell of Doraville, GA. The Chapter donated \$200 to the Moss Foundation for Children's Education and \$100 each to the two students whom the Chapter sponsored for the Anne and Matt Harbison Scholarship in 2013.

In 2014, the Chapter continued its support of the St. Petersburg Clothes to Kids Project with a clothing donation valued at approximately \$500. Other donations in 2014 included clothing valued at approximately \$1,000 to Women's Residence (a division of the St. Petersburg Free Clinic), non-perishable food items valued at \$200 to the Food Pantry (a division of the St. Petersburg Free Clinic), and \$100 to the Meals of Hope program. Members of the chapter also volunteered to help package meals. The Chapter also donated \$100 to help with the college expenses of a local student.

PAT'S ANGELS Chapter (Holland, PA) members donated baskets for a raffle and purchased school supplies for needy children in their community in 2013 & 2014.

PAT'S BLUE GOOSE Chapter (Louisa, VA) members raised funds for Nathan Harris Joos in 2013. Nathan was born with a rare genetic disorder called Haermann-Streiff-Francosis Syndrome. The Chapter obtained a remarked *Image of Peace* Moss print from the Society's Charity Print Program and raised \$2,654 through the sale of raffle tickets. The print was framed by Framecraft in War-

renton, VA, and the lucky winner was Susie Whiting of Afton, VA. Additional funds in the amount of \$1,543.55 were raised through a Longaberger® Basket Bingo, and the Chapter also received \$60 in donations. A total of \$4,257.55 was raised for Nathan.

Chapter members also donated 50 gift bags for the Moss Collectors' Convention in Roanoke, VA; volunteered at Framecraft's Show with Pat as well as Pat's Barn Shows; visited residents at Louisa Health Care and Amerisist in Louisa County; and one member sang with the Community Chorus in two performances at the Louisa Methodist Church to help raise funds for the local food pantry.

In 2014 the Chapter obtained a remarked *Valley Stream* from the Society and raised \$1,062 via a raffle. The Chapter also held a Longaberger® Basket Bingo and raised \$5,747.70 to help with the medical expenses of Trey Pugh. Members continued to visit the sick and elderly at local hospitals and nursing homes, and one member served as a "Breakfast Buddy" at Thomas Jefferson Elementary School in Louisa, VA.

PAT'S CATS Chapter (Martinsville, VA) members collected paper products for the dental clinic in Martinsville, donated items for gift bags for the Moss Collectors' Convention in Roanoke, and also donated items for the Grace Network in Martinsville in 2013.

In 2014 the Chapter gave a donation to Mountain Valley Hospice

and provided clothes and toys for a child on the Salvation Army Angel Tree. The Chapter also assisted the Bassett Historical Center in obtaining a print of *A Peaceful Place* from the Society's Charity Print Program for its silent auction. The print raised \$170, and the lucky winner was Linda Read.

THREE RIVERS MOSS Chapter (Pittsburgh, PA) members raised funds in 2013 with their Fun-d Calendar, a silent auction for baked goods, a gift auction among their membership, as well as raffles conducted during each Chapter meeting. The Chapter awarded a scholarship in the amount of \$500 to Anna Dukovich, who used the money for her college expenses. The Chapter had sponsored Anna for a scholarship from the P. Buckley Moss Foundation for Children's Education, but she was not selected. Chapter members also donated spa products to women's shelters and group homes.

In 2014 the Chapter raised funds with their Fun-d Calendar, a wrapped gift auction among their membership, a silent auction for gift baskets, and raffles conducted during Chapter meetings. The Chapter also obtained a *Conewago Creek's Humpback Bridge* from the Society's Charity Print Program and raised \$879 via a raffle. Framing was donated by Frames and More. The total amount raised from fundraising activities was \$1,717.81. The Chapter used the funds to award two Three Rivers Moss Scholarships of \$500 each.

Total raised for charity in these chapter reports is over \$34,875. Amazing!

Highlights from the Society's 2014 Tour

Society members joined Pat and her daughter Patty for the "San Francisco and Wine Country Delights" tour, August 29-September 5, 2014. The tour started in the San Francisco Bay area, and the participants enjoyed seeing Chinatown, Haight-Ashbury, Alcatraz, Sausalito, and Muir Woods. From San Francisco, they traveled by motor coach to Sonoma, where they visited several vineyards. They also took the Wine Train from the Town of Napa to St. Helena, stopping at Rutherford along the way. One of the highlights of the Sonoma portion of the trip was a visit to the Ramekins Culinary School, where the group enjoyed a wine pairing dinner that they prepared themselves with assistance from the school's chefs.

A special thank-you is due to Bonnie-Lou Binnig, President of the Moss Pelicans Chapter, for doing such a wonderful job of coordinating the trip.



San Francisco was originally settled by the native Ohlone people around 10,000 years ago. The first European contact is believed to have been when Sir Francis Drake sailed past the entrance to San Francisco Bay in 1579. The area remained devoid of Europeans until 1775 when the Spanish ventured north on a "Sacred Expedition" led by Gaspar de Portola. The Spanish founded the Presidio Army Base there in 1776, and the roots of the city were planted.



Muir Woods National Park is on the Sausalito side of the Golden Gate Bridge and is the home of coastal redwoods, the largest tree species in the world. Here, Pat and Patty are standing inside the trunk of one of the trees.



Domaine Carneros in Sonoma specializes in sparkling wines, and the group learned about the process for making them.



The Wine Train was one of the group's favorite parts of the tour. They learned about wine and wine making and did some wine tasting, while enjoying the gorgeous scenery of wine country.



The group was especially excited to take a tour of Alcatraz Island, also known as The Rock, which is rumored to be haunted. The federal prison on Alcatraz, located in San Francisco Bay, housed some of the nation's most dangerous felons during its years of operation from 1934 to 1963. No inmate ever successfully escaped from The Rock.




