MISSION STATEMENT

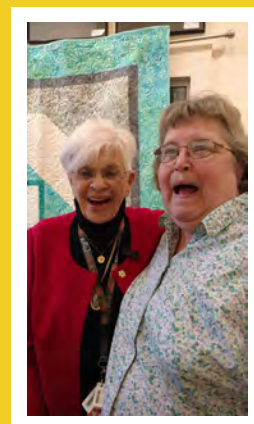

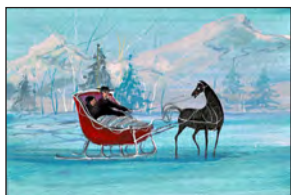
"As an added benefit for active Society members in 2018, we are excited to offer you a new small print every season (four total for 2018) that you can purchase with no shipping charge, and 5% of the proceeds will go to the Moss Foundation. These giclées will be available to all collectors, but only active Society members will benefit with free shipping and the Foundation donation. You must provide your Society member number when ordering this print." Each print will have a designated date to purchase by to be able to apply the "no shipping" charge and donation.

Winter: January 25 – March 31, 2018
Summer: July 1 – September 30, 2018

Spring: April 1 – June 30, 2018
Fall: October 1 – December 31, 2018

The Winter print was Red Sleigh. Red Sleigh is still available; however, it is no longer eligible for the donation or free shipping.

The current 2018 Spring print promotion for Society members is the new giclée, *Scarlet Visitor*. *Scarlet Visitor* is \$45 with an image size of 5-1/2 x 4 ins. From now through June 30th, when an active Society member orders *Scarlet Visitor*, we will ship the giclée for free and donate 5% of the sale to the Moss Foundation.

The Foundation was created and initially funded in 1995 by the P. Buckley Moss Society, an organization of over 15,000 members worldwide. The Society's local chapters use creative fundraisers to support charitable projects within their communities.

Dear Moss Society,

I would like to extend the Foundation Board's gratitude to the Moss Society and friends for a successful 2017. Through our annual quilt raffle, Foundation dinner, trips and incredible generosity of donors, we were able to provide assistance to students, schools and summer arts programs.

Here is what we accomplished in 2017:

\$1500 Harbison Scholarship award to Brian Meersma, Cornell University

\$1500 PBM Endowed Scholarship to Anna Marie Hollar, Savannah College of Art & Design

\$1000 PBM Endowed Scholarship to Andrew Swiger, University of South Carolina

\$2000 Martin's Scholarship to Nathan Dietrich, Carroll Community College

\$2000 Martin's Scholarship to Benjamin Berger, Loyola

\$2000 Staunton-Augusta Summer Arts Education Program

\$2838.34 in Teachers Grants given to 5 schools.

2018 Quilt Raffle Another beautiful quilt has been selected by the Foundation Board for the 2018 Quilt Raffle. This year's quilt, *Our First Outing*, was created and donated by Lana Kleimon of Marietta, GA. This large quilt features an original Moss painted centerpiece of an Amish buggy. The tickets are the same price as last year, 1 for \$3, or 2 for \$5. Last year's quilt raffle raised \$1,853 for the PBM Endowed Scholarship. Let's see if we can double the amount for this year. Tickets are available from the Foundation office. Be sure to check with your local Moss dealer as many of them will have tickets too. The quilt will be touring with Pat to some gallery shows which will provide a variety of opportunities for you to view this work of art.



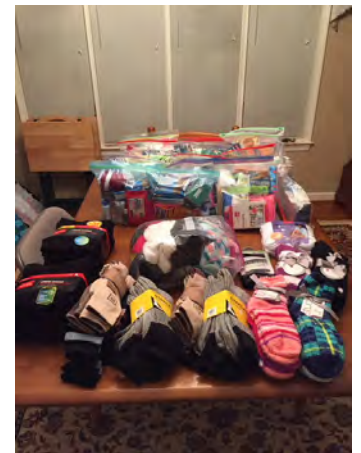
Chapters Continue Charity Efforts, Activities

FRIENDS MEETING Chapter (Waynesville, OH) During Pat's show at the Canada Goose Gallery in October 2017, this chapter organized a Charity Auction and Dinner to benefit the Moss Foundation and Pal's for Life. A Moss quilt was auctioned off and a total of \$3,000 was raised with \$1,500 for the Moss Foundation and \$1,500 for Pals for Life. The sale of dinner tickets for the event totaled \$3,400 for Pals for Life.

LAKE MARBURG Chapter (Hanover, PA) At the end of 2017, the chapter participated in Santa's Sleepers, a community program that collects new pajamas and donates them to local children at Christmastime. The chapter awards two \$2,000 scholarships locally to challenged students each year. The latest two winners were chosen unanimously: Benjamin Berger and Nathan Dietrich.

MOSS IN THE FOREST Chapter (Forest, VA) In December 2017, the chapter conducted

a raffle and donated \$325 to Wheels on the James for the purpose of purchasing an AmTryke therapeutic cycle. During the month of February 2017, members delivered blankets, hats, gloves, socks and "necessary kits" for women to WarmStreets, a local organization that helps the homeless in the Central Virginia region. Throughout the year of 2017, chapter members collected items for the local YMCA Domestic Violence Center.

MOSS IN THE VALLEY Chapter (Roanoke, VA) The chapter's 2017 Charity was a raffle to benefit The Andrew McKeever Fund for Children, an Educational Fund of the Virginia

Museum of Transportation. Total raised \$2,035.00.

Other charitable projects include: Made and donated over 300 butterflies for the "Butterfly Hugs" for cancer patients; Provided ice cream party for Veterans at VA Medical Center; Donated \$325 to Ronald McDonald House; Donated \$100 to the P. Buckley Moss Foundation Scholarship Program; Donated \$100 to God's Pit Crew for Hurricane Victims; Donated \$100 to St. Francis Angels of Assisi; Provided dinner during the month of November for residents and guest of Ronald McDonald House.

As of March, 2018, Moss in the Valley merged with Moss in the Country and many members transferred to Moss in the Country. The Moss in the Valley chapter is now dissolved.

MOSS ON THE JAMES Chapter (Richmond, VA) This lively chapter continues to grow and began its year by volunteering at CJ's Thumbs Up for their annual ball. CJ's provides assistance to families of seriously ill children. In April, the chapter held its Annual Tea to benefit Richmond's United Methodist Family Services, which began as an orphanage in 1900. Chapter member Floyd Booth had been raised at UMFS, which provided a personal connection for chapter members. Other projects through the year saw chapter members making and serving

meals at the Doorways, a hospitality house for family members of long term patients at VCU's Medical College of Virginia.

MOSSAPHILE Chapter (Atlanta, GA) The 2017 Mossaphile Charity Print, a *remarque of Appalachian Summer*, raised \$950 for the Moss Foundation. The chapter donated an additional \$100 to the Foundation. The chapter gave \$50 to Snax Sax, local program that delivers food bags to local school to be sent home with needy students to supplement their diets during the weekend. A \$50 donation was given to the Foundation in memory of Mossaphile member Doris Maisel. Chapter members also collected canned and non-perishable goods for the Atlanta Community Food Bank.

PAT'S CATS Chapter (Martinsville, VA) During 2017, Pat's Cats provided a Thank You meal for the 911 operators in Henry County and provided canned food to the Grace Network, a local organization which distributes food and provides help with utility bills.

THREE RIVERS MOSS Chapter (Great Pittsburgh Area, PA) The chapter awarded two scholarships for the 2016-2017 school year to senior students with learning differences. Each recipient received \$500. The scholarships were funded by several fundraisers including Fun-d Calendar which raised \$245, a gift auction which raised \$150, raffles at chapter meetings, and a raffle of a *remarqued Oasis* giclée with ticket sales totaling \$263. Chapter members participated in various service projects including Pack a Purse Donation Project which benefits women's shelters.

TREES OF LIFE Chapter (Defiance, OH) This generous chapter raised \$20,000 at their Sept. 17th benefit for Erica Reineck. Erica is a 17 year old high school senior who was seriously injured in a car/semi accident last June. The benefit was an encore

performance of "Defiance Has Talent and Heart." The crowd of 520 people "voted" by placing donations in a bucket for their favorite entertainer. In addition to the donations collected, funds were raised through a silent auction, live auction of a beautiful remarque of *A Butterfly's Touch* done by Pat, 50/50 drawing, and an October raffle calendar which included 18 prizes. The top prize was the P. Buckley Moss giclee *Piedmont Retreat* framed by The Corner Gallery of Archbold. This was the 7th year for doing "Defiance Has Talent", and it has become a very popular event.

Total raised for charity in these chapter reports is over \$35,193. Great! A big thank you also to these chapters for the numerous service projects in which they participated.

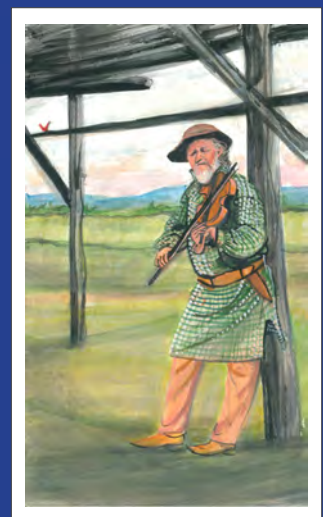
